Meaning of **Śivēti Śaurīti (Āśrama Nitya Prārthana)** (The universal prayer sung daily at the ashrama)

Composed by His Holiness Sri Sri Sri Ganapati Sachchidananda Swamiji

- 1. We seek refuge in that one God who is worshipped with devotion in the world, especially in India as Śiva, Viṣṇu, Ganeśa, Subrahmaṇya, Dēvi, and Sūrya.
- 2. We seek refuge in that one God by whose command the sun shines in the sky, fire burns readily, and the wind blows constantly.
- 3. We seek refuge in that one God who takes the form of Water, Fire, Earth, Air, and Space.
- 4. We seek refuge in that one God who is worshipped in the middle of a forest, on a mountain peak, on a river bank, in the center of a pond, or inside a home.

- 5. We seek refuge in that one God who is the Maker, the Preserver, and the Destroyer of the Universe, who is most ancient yet ever new.
- 6. We seek refuge in that one God who is called by different names such as Allah, Jina, Buddha, and God by the English speaking people.
- 7. We seek refuge in that one God whose infinite glory is proclaimed in the Bible, the Q'uran, the Śastras, the Vedas, and the Puraṇas.
- 8. We seek refuge in that one God who is worshipped and praised in song in churches, mosques, and in holy shrines through prayer, namaz, or ritual worship.
- 9. We seek refuge in that one God Sat-Cit-Ānanda who Himself flourishes with the countless names that He assumes, is resplendent in the infinite forms that He takes, and is filled with inestimable powers, virtues, and attributes.
